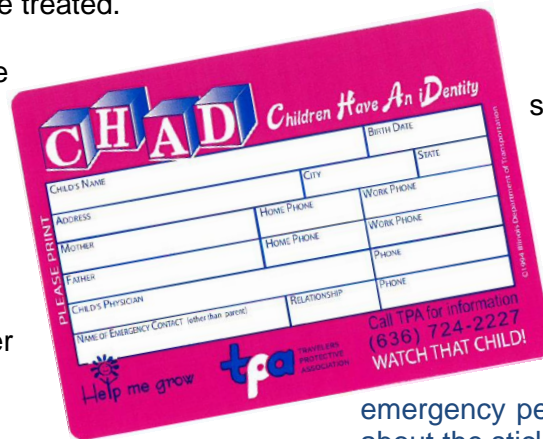
Children Have An iDentity

The CHAD safety seat child identification program has been developed as a result of a traffic crash involving a 13-month-old boy named Chad. The babysitter who was driving was killed. Chad was injured, but no one at the scene knew his identity. Only because an emergency room nurse recognized him could his parents be quickly located and his injuries be treated.

This program not only promotes Child Safety, but is a good public relations tool for TPA as well.

The National Board of the Travelers Protective Association, in keeping with the organization's **WATCH THAT CHILD!** and **MAKE SAFETY FIRST AND MAKE IT LAST** slogans, have adopted the CHAD sticker program as a national safety program.



To ensure rapid identification of children in emergencies, parents and guardians of small children are encouraged to fill out the information on the sticker and place it on the right front corner (child's right) under the cushion or center back of the child's safety seat.

T.P.A. posts should educate emergency personnel in their communities about the stickers so that they know to look for the sticker when a child is involved in an accident.

Posts throughout the nation are encouraged to purchase these stickers bearing the TPA logo at a nominal cost and distribute them to local police and emergency medical services agencies, preschools, PTA groups,
